



Write stories on Human Rights!

Instructions

Divide participants in several groups. Show each group the 4 posters. Ask participants to look at the posters for a few minutes and write down a key word from

each figure. Based on that word, ask them to develop a human rights story, explaining how the chosen word connects with human rights and with their own situation.

To give additional information to the participants, looking at the images can be combined with showing the video presentations of the posters (you can find them under the "Videos" module of the Toolkit).

They can also look at the "Presentation Universal Declaration of Human Rights", under the module "PowerPoints".

At the end, each group has to read their own stories in front of everybody.

A debate can be started comparing the results of each group. Some questions to ask:

- why did you choose that word?
- what does each poster tell to you about human rights?
- when you compare it with the words your colleagues chose, how does that relate to your group?
- do you agree with the choices of the others? Give your comments on that.

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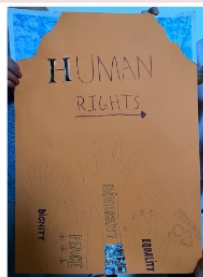

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HUMAN RIGHTS

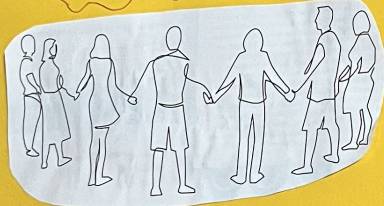


Definition
Human rights are standards that recognize and protect the dignity of all human beings. Human rights govern how individual human beings live in societies and with each other, as well as their relationship with the State and the obligations that the State have towards them.



UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS

The UN General Assembly adopted the declaration on 10.12.1948 and is considered as the foundation of international human rights law. It consists of 30 articles such as art. 1 Right to equality, art. 2 Right to freedom of discrimination and ex. art. 18 freedom of belief and religion.



How do these rights apply to you?

- You, along with all individuals are equal as human beings and by virtue of the dignity of each human being. Every person and all people are entitled to active, free and meaningful participation in and political, economic, social and cultural development, through which human rights and fundamental freedoms are applied.
- States must use the UDHR and apply it to all citizens equally, which includes you.
- In your daily life, you must be able to have all human rights that are given to humans and governments must provide these rights to you, or else it is considered a violation of Human rights.



The inefficiency of human rights:

- Human rights advocates (Amnesty International, Human Rights Watch) agree that, sixty years after its issue, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights is still more a dream than reality.
- ↳ For example, Amnesty International's 2003 World and other reputable sources show that many individuals in the world still are:
 - Tortured or abused in at least 81 countries
 - Face unfair trials in at least 54 countries
 - Restricted in their freedom of expression in at least 77 countries
- Governments are, sadly, in many cases, responsible for these violations or take no action to prevent these events from happening.

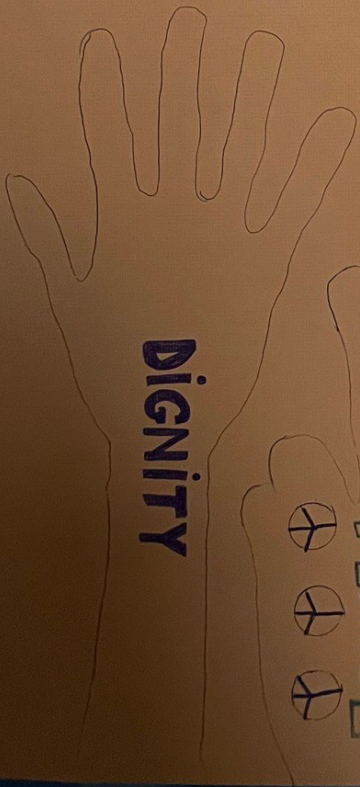
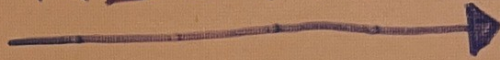
